She carves original designs into wood or linoleum, prints them on paper and then tints the image with watercolor. Not only is Ms. Karr Kaufenberg a prolific artist and business woman she has earned numerous awards since 2018. The Cultural Centre encourages you to view and be inspired by the skilled artistry of Nan Karr Kaufenberg. The Artist Reception will be September 11, 2021 from 1- 3 PM during the Yellowstone Trail Sociability Run.

The Cultural Centre welcomes **Dona Larkin** in **October**. Dona, a free-lance artist lives south of Renville, Minnesota and has sold her work throughout the United States, Canada, Europe and through Sotheby's.com. Dona has three different series of work in progress at all times. An award-winning artist, her work has been exhibited throughout the United States in juried exhibitions. Acrylic, oil and gouache are her preferred mediums. Ms. Larkin's works

vary in size from miniatures to murals. Her murals may be seen in public places throughout Southwest Minnesota like Rice Memorial Hospital in Willmar, Redwood County Child Advocacy Center and the Redwood County Courthouse both located in Redwood Falls, Minnesota. Dona's Artist Reception will be October 16, 2021 from 1-3 PM at which time you may also purchase her signed illustrated Christmas book, "Eldon the Elf Who Grew Too Tall" written by author, Tom Wiborg.

November 1st to December 10th Sheila Jacobs and Tom Jacobs return to the Cultural Centre. The Jacobs are residents of rural Olivia, Minnesota with roots in Bird Island. Sheila is a visual artist, potter, stain glass artist and Tom creates functional works of art in wood. Both have received recognition as environmentalists. To kick off the "Old Fashioned Christmas", on December 3rd, Sheila and Tom's Artist Reception will be from 4:00 – 7:30 PM. during the first annual Christmas Market in Bird Island located in front of the Cultural Centre. Sheila's work is a celebration of life long learning. Observing her father and artist, Butch Olson, as small child, she learned the intricacies of the creative process. We are honored to exhibit the Jacobs' works of art. Sheila, an award-winning artist, and Tom embody the discipline, ingenuity and precision required for professional creative expression.

"The Renville County Market in Bird Island" is a community celebration sponsored by "Developing Roots" and the "Cultural Centre in Bird Island" located on Dogwood Avenue between Main Street and 6th Street. This opportunity for food vendors, fresh fruit/vegetable stands, fund-raisers, craft vendors, and musicians to sell their wares and share their talents is a big success! Community Elders Documentary Film Making Project

BOLD and BLHS School Districts (with 189 students grades 11-12) will partner with the Cultural Centre in Bird Island, Tom Cherveney (West Central Tribune Reporter), Paul Heyl (Social Worker/Interviewer), and Mark Haen (Media Specialist) using small group learning to provide hands-on experience in professional cinematic production. The schools provide basic arts programs, history, social sciences, and speech/english classes. Training in the cinematic arts has not been in the curriculum.

The Documentary Film Making of Community Elders Project will build on history, art, speech/english and social science classes now offered. Maximum class size will be 16 students, 2 adult community participants, and up to 18 interview subjects to insure everyone receives hands-on practice in all skills. The professional(s) will demonstrate each skill, students will practice the skill, feedback will be provided and the skill practiced again. The process will be repeated until proficiency is achieved.

Classes will be provided during school year 2021-2022, four hours per week for students and adults. Students will become proficient in the use of all cinematic equipment, will practice/learn personal and public interview skills, use and practice story boards and script writing, and participate in all aspects in the production of two films. Each film will be edited by students for public and family audiences. A screening at Pioneer TV and critique of the final film productions will be done by Pioneer production staff.

Availability of cinematic skills will enable the Cultural Centre to offer a billable professional product to families that would preserve the memories and lives of family members. The income would insure future availability of the service.
